Double yellow lines on Kitchener Road and Chattenden Lane are there to keep our children safe, do not park on them. We are urging our parents and children to take extra care during this time, since we do not have a Road Crossing Patrol Officer. Discussions are taking place with Medway Council to resolve this matter as soon as possible.
