Parent Workshop

We recently asked parents of SEND children within the school if they would like us to run parent workshops. The responses were really helpful and I can now confirm we have arranged a few workshops on the themes that were most prominent. The first of these sessions will be held on Tuesday 28th of September at 9am, this session will be aimed towards parents with children who either have an ASD diagnosis or who are displaying ASD tendencies. The session will be in person (COVID allowing) at school. More details will follow nearer the time.

ParentPay

As previously advised, we will be fully "cashless" as a school from September and all payments for clubs, trips, etc will need to be made online through our secure ParentPay system. Many of our parents already pay through this and will be familiar with the payments.



Letters will come out in September with details of how you can sign up to ParentPay if you have not already done so. If you do not have access to online banking you will be able to make payments in certain shops through the PayPoint system.

Chartwells, the catering company who provide our school lunches, are also exploring the possibility of providing some sort of online payment system but this may not be through ParentPay. We will advise you once this system is being introduced but in the meantime payments for school lunches will need to continue to be paid by cheque (payable to Chartwells) or by cash.
